History and Characteristics

The College of Charleston is situated in the midst of a city that treasures its past while promoting its future, the College of Charleston and The Graduate School of the College of Charleston share one of the nation's most beautiful historic campuses. Founded in 1770 and chartered in 1785, the College is the oldest institution of higher education in South Carolina and the thirteenth oldest in the United States. In 1836 it became the nation's first municipal college, and in 1970 the College joined the state higher education system. In 1992, The Graduate School of the College of Charleston was established for graduate studies, professional development and community services, and faculty research and grant administration. Today, this modern, thriving academic institution offers a world-class liberal arts education for more than 10,000 undergraduate and graduate students.

The College's destiny is excellence in education. Of the 522 full-time roster faculty, 85% have earned the Ph.D. or the highest degrees in their fields (taken from the common data set for the fall 2006 semester). The student/faculty ratio is 13:1. An enduring commitment to the liberal arts and sciences is seen in the core curriculum of the College, which requires study in English, history, modern and classical languages, math, science, the arts, and the social sciences. More than 49 degrees in 44 majors and 24 interdisciplinary minors, innovative teaching techniques such as a marketing course taught entirely in French, and national and international exchange programs with academic institutions in Europe, Africa, and Asia, as well as colleges throughout the United States, offer global opportunities for intellectual and personal growth. Students in the Paul T. Nelson Global Logistics and Transportation Program study operations at one of the nation's busiest ports, aspiring marine biologists explore the rich "living laboratory" of the region's coastline, and promising artists develop their skills by participating internationally acclaimed arts festivals, including Spoleto, U.S.A. These are only a few of the distinctive education options to students matriculating at the College of Charleston.

The College of Charleston is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) to award the Artium Baccalaureates, the Bachelor of Arts, the Bachelor of Science, the Master of Arts, the Master of Arts in Teaching, the Master of Science, the Master of Education, and the Master of Public Administration. The program majors and concentrations within those degrees are attached to this document.

Locations and Distance Education

The College of Charleston is located in downtown Charleston, South Carolina. We have an additional site that offers a selection of general degree requirement courses at the College of Charleston-North (note we use the word campus in the generic sense to describe this location—it is governed by the College of Charleston's Board of Trustees, has a budget that is set through the standard budgeting process, and reports to the President of the College, Conrad D. Festa). There is not a site where a student can obtain 50% of their degree credits except at the downtown campus.

The College has a very limited number of courses whose primary delivery mechanism is electronic (mainly through our WebCT system) that also have at the minimum an organizational meeting at the College's downtown or North Area sites. The students are primarily from the State of South Carolina, although in some cases may be located in other states.

There are no undergraduate degree programs that are offered via non-traditional delivery methods and the only certificate program through which a majority of the credits may be earned via electronic methods is the Certificate in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL).
